WHAT SAFEGUARDING MEANS

- Preventing harm to health or development
- Ensuring safe and effective care
- Helping children to have the best outcomes

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT

- Staff who listen, notice and act.
- Clear systems for reporting and responding to any concerns.
- Support for your child's wellbeing and mental health.
- Information and support to help you keep your child safe.

ONLINE SAFETY
We teach children how to stay safe online and monitor internet use in school.



BULLYING
We do not tolerate bullying. We teach kindness and respect and deal with any bullying quickly.

SAFE SITE

TREAT OTHERS KINDLY

We are kind, respectful and include everyone.

Tell an adult if you are being bullied or if someone is unkind. We will listen and help.



STAY SAFE ONLINE

Be kind online.

Don't share personal information.

Tell an adult if something upsets or worries you.



SAFE AT SCHOOL

Our school is a safe place.

Visitors are checked in.

We have rules to keep everyone safe.
